Cathedral of St. John the Baptist

Organized in the late 1700's this is the oldest Roman Catholic Church in Georgia. The congregation erected its first house of worship and in Liberty Square and in the 1830's a larger church was built. In 1876, the gothic cathedral was dedicated.

Organized in 1800, First Baptist Church, was granted a perpetual charter in 1801 by Governor Josiah Tattnall Jr. and moved into its newly completed sanctuary in 1833.

First Bryan Baptist Church was formed in 1802 by William Bryan. On the church steps General Sherman read the Emancipation Proclamation to Savannah residents. Almost a Century later, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. preached his "I Have a Dream" sermon.

Trinity United Methodist Church is the oldest Methodist church in Savannah. Dedicated in 1848, the church is constructed of Savannah gray brick with a stucco finish. Virgin Longleaf Georgia Pines were used for framing, flooring, and wainscoting.
